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The book report format allows students to share important information about the books they are reading. Body pointsIn the main body of the book report are described by the characters of the book, the purpose of the book and the plot. At the secondary and secondary level, most teachers tend to expect three body paragraphs. With introduction and conclusion, this is a classic five-point essay. If you're lucky, your teacher may only want one body paragraph to report a book. If you're unlucky, they may want more than three. Support: Offer about five to seven sentences by providing examples from the book that support your thesis. Closing: See how well I supported my thesis!
